DAY 1 - Arrival in Quito

You will arrive at Quito International Airport; rental car reservations will be properly made and the counter agent will have your information prior to your arrival at the rental car counter located a few steps next to Local Arrivals.

The car rental agent will ask for your passport, driver's license, and credit card for a deposit in case there are any traffic speed tickets or damages to the vehicle that will not be covered by the insurance.

The entire city of Quito is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, standing at an altitude of 9,350 feet (2,850 m) and welcoming visitors with its picturesque plazas situated between mountain peaks. The city has an abundance of market stands, shamanistic healers, and fourth-generation hat makers, as well as a vibrant and sophisticated culinary and nightlife scene.

DAY 2 - Hotsprings in Termas de Papallacta

After a delicious breakfast, your GPS will be set to take you to Papallacta, situated at 3,700 meters in the midst of an evergreen paramo landscape (Andean high grasslands), which is renowned for its hot springs. At the Termas de Papallacta resort and spa, you can relax and enjoy its pools, naturally heated by the volcanic hot springs. Also, if the weather is clear, you will be able to see the giant Antisana Volcano (reaching a height of 5,758 meters) looming above.

DAY 3 – Papallacta – Tena

Today, you will be driving just a few hours east of Papallacta, Tena Ecuador is one of Ecuador's major gateways to the Amazon Rainforest. The elevation of Tena is 1,962 feet (598 meters). Since most visitors arrive in Tena from Quito, high up in the Andes at 9,350 feet (2,850 meters), you'll absolutely feel the change in elevation when you arrive! The drive is along a twisty road down from the mountains into the rainforest.

It feels a bit precarious but is quite safe. Given its rainforest location, it sprinkles or drizzles for at least a short time almost every day in Tena. Expect an afternoon shower and overcast skies, but don't expect torrential rain all day every day.



DAY 4 – Tena – Baños

After spending the day in Tena, enjoy one last time what you have pending in this adventurous city before parting to the Amazon city of Baños. Drive along the avenue of the waterfalls and notice how the vegetation shifters. Once you arrive at your hotel in Baños, spend the rest of the day at leisure.

DAY 5 – Baños – Cotopaxi Hacienda

In the morning, you will continue your journey to Pailon del Diablo Waterfall, the same day you will arrive at the Hacienda after 3 hours on the road. National Parks usually close at 17h00 so you will have enough time to rest and you could do horseback riding (Optional). Enjoy the history behind the corridors and walls of one of the oldest haciendas of the Cotopaxi region where you will spend the night.


DAY 6 – Cotopaxi Hacienda – Quilotoa Lagoon - Quito

The return can become a bit longer, so you have the option to rent a mule for the uphill hike. In the afternoon, you return to Quito.



If you're feeling adventurous, ride a cable car up the slopes of nearby Volcán Pichincha for dizzying views over the city from 12,942 feet (3,944 m).



DAY 3 – Quito – Mindo

Today you'll explore the lush green cloud forest of Mindo. Its location at the western slopes of the Andean highlands gives this region mild temperatures and lots of rainfall. Thanks to the favorable conditions, the Mindo forest has incredibly high

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biodiversity. You'll get the chance to see some of the countless birds, butterflies, and insect species that call the region home. Visit the butterfly garden, hike to beautiful waterfalls, or fly between the treetops on a zipline. Afterwards, take a chance and learn to make chocolate and taste your creations.

DAY 4 – Mindo – Cotopaxi Hacienda

Spend your last few moments strolling through Mindo, before making you towards Cotopaxi National Park. National Parks usually close at 17h00 so you will have enough time to rest and you could do horseback riding (Optional). Enjoy the history behind the corridors and walls of one of the oldest haciendas of the Cotopaxi region where you will spend the night.

DAY 5 – Cotopaxi Hacienda – Pailon del Diablo – Baños

Upon arrival, check in to your hotel and rest a little bit. Driving south from Baños in the afternoon, following the "Avenue of waterfalls", you will follow the Pastaza River on its way through the valley of the same name. Passing a number of waterfalls, you will reach the village of Rio Verde, where you will stop to visit the well-known El Pailon del Diablo (The Devil's Cauldron) waterfall. You may also rent a bike and ride to the waterfall.


DAY 6 – Baños – Tena

Snack on fruits and other snacks while you browse the stalls for paintings, carvings, handpainted bowls, and much more. Enjoy some street food (try the salted mango or fritada con mote-fried pork with cooked corn, then continue to the nearby town of Cotacachi for some free time and more shopping (the town is famous for its leather products). In the afternoon, stroll along the shores of the volcanic crater lake of Cuicocha. You can even take a boat ride around the two islands.

DAY 9 – Otavalo & Peguche Waterfall – Quito

You will head to the small waterfall Peguche, formed by the river of the same name. This waterfall is considered an indigenous ceremonial site. After visiting the waterfall, you could also stop by the local artisans who live and work in this area.



Here, you will have a spectacular view of Cotopaxi Volcano's gigantic cone. Lake Limpiopungo offers a variety of birds, and occasionally even wild horses. A short walk around the lake will allow you to admire the Andean plant and animal life along the way. You will reach your traditional Hacienda just in time for lunch (not included). The afternoon is at leisure. You may choose to go for a scenic horseback excursion at the foothills of the Rumiñahui volcano, explore the surroundings of the Hacienda on a mountain bike or just relax in your cozy room.

DAY 5 – Cotopaxi Hacienda – Pailon del Diablo – Baños

DAY 7 – Baños – Chimborazo - Riobamba

Today you will leave Baños after breakfast and make your way to the impressive volcano Chimborazo. You should already be able to spot it several times along the way. If the altitude does not affect you, take a walk to the refuge Carrell at 4.800 m and enjoy the splendid view of surrounding valleys and mountains. Afterward, continue your journey towards Riobamba, where you will spend the night.

DAY 8 – Riobamba - Cuenca

This morning you will continue your journey south to Cuenca, passing through the dunes of Palmira. If time and weather conditions allow, you can pass through Baños del Inca, which contains some special ruins and a fantastic hot spring. From here you will continue to Cuenca where you will be able to spend the rest of the afternoon at leisure.

DAY 9 – Exploring Cuenca

Stroll through the cobblestone streets of Cuenca's old town and see the various plazas and churches. Explore the beautiful scenery of the Azuay province and the picturesque small villages, such as Chordeleg, known for silver and gold handicrafts, Gualaceo with its orchid farm or Zigzig with its market. Return to Cuenca in the afternoon for another night at your hotel in the colonial part of town.

DAY 10 – Cuenca – Cajas National Park – Guayaquil

Your first stop today is the beautiful Cajas National Park. This National Park comprises more than 200 interconnected high-altitude lagoons. The Cajas is not only a source of many rivers but even connects to the Pacific and the Atlantic Ocean. You have some time to enjoy the view from the lookout or to take a short walk to one of the many lagoons. Afterward, you continue your journey westwards and you can stop at a Hacienda where you will get to know the process of chocolate making and where you may have a delicious, local lunch. In the afternoon, you will drive through lush vegetation until reaching Ecuador's biggest city, Guayaguil.



DAY 11 – Free Day in Guayaquil

Today you will explore Guayaquil with your car rental, we suggest starting with a visit to the Seminario Park, a very popular meeting point for young Ecuadorian lovers. Furthermore, this little park is well-known for its land iguanas which laze about in the trees while they catch the sun. You can visit the Cathedral, built in classical gothic style and then we move on to Guayaquil's famous wide, tree-lined waterfront, "El Malecon", that runs alongside the river Guayas. The next stop will be the historic local government buildings, the "Palacio Municipal" and then the "Palacio de Gobernacion"


(the Government Palace). Right in front of this palace is the Moorish clock tower "La Torre Morisca", which was built in 1843, and with a little effort climbing its steep stairs, we can enjoy the views across the city. La Rotonda, another historic monument, is a statue that marks the meeting between Simon Bolivar and Jose San Martin in 1822. The old district of Las Peñas, a vestige of old Guayaquil to the north end of the Malecon, is a picturesque neighborhood built on the Cerro Santa Ana hill on the edge of the river. Climbing the stairway amid the brightly painted wooden houses, you will gain a different perspective of Ecuador's largest city.
